Finch West LRT

Driving around Finch Avenue West is changing!

The first section of Light Rail Transit guideway and track is being installed down the centre of Finch Avenue West between Sentinel Road and Norfinch Drive. There will be important changes to how motorists use intersections and

to how motorists use intersections and lanes in this area.

U-turns and Dedicated Left-turn Signal
Signalized intersections will have a

 Mid-block destinations will become right-in/right-out only onto Finch
 To access mid-block entrances on the other side of the road, motorists can make U-turns at signalized intersections when the left-turn signal is illuminated

Temporary Traffic Restrictions

- York Gate Boulevard north of Finch will be closed for two months
 Driftwood Avenue will be limited to
- right-in/right-out only movements from Finch for three weeks
